## Upkeep of railway infrastructure

- 1725. SHRIMATI RENUKA CHOWDHURY: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the number of accidents has increased in the recent past due to accumulated deficit in upkeep of railway infrastructure as a result of decades of neglect;
- (b) if so, the reasons therefor along with the number of such accidents occurred during the last three years, Zone-wise; and
- (c) the steps taken by Government to formulate an action plan for regular upkeep of railway infrastructure?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAJEN GOHAIN): (a) to (c) No, Sir. Safety is given the top most priority. Assets are maintained as per standards codified in the various manuals. As a result, number of consequential train accidents (including accidents at Unmanned Level Crossings mainly caused due to negligence of road vehicle users) have decreased from 135 in 2014-15, to 107 in 2015-16 and further to 104 in 2016-17. In the current year (upto 28th February, 2018) the number of consequential train accidents have further reduced to 70 as compared to 99 in the corresponding period of the previous year.

## Railway line from Tuni to Visakhapatnam

1726. SHRI V. VIJAYASAI REDDY: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that there is a long pending demand from the people and public representatives for a third railway line from Tuni to Visakhapatnam *via* Narsipatnam, Chodavaram, Madugula and Kothavalasa, as this is a safe route, particularly during monsoons, and the existing track is very near to seashore; and
  - (b) if so, the steps Ministry has taken on this proposal, so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAJEN GOHAIN): (a) and (b) A Survey for provision of a new BG single line from Tuni to Kothavalsa (155.34 Km) *via* Narsipatnam, Chodavaram, Madugula was sanctioned *vide* Blue Book 2016-17. Survey work of this new line from Kothavalasa to Tuni *via* Narsipatnam, Madugula has been completed at a cost of ₹ 3771.21 crore and ROR of (-) 4.14%. Survey report is under examination.
