National Teachers' Training Policy

Vacant posts of teachers in Kendriya Vidyalayas

2328. DR. V. MAITREYAN: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government has taken steps to appoint teachers to fill the vacant posts in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) the total number of posts vacant, as on date?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI UPENDRA KUSHWAHA): (a) and (b) Filling up of vacancies is a continuous process and action is taken by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) from time to time, as per the provisions of the relevant Recruitment Rules. KVS has informed that 6255 vacancies of teaching staff (Teachers – 6170, Principals-85) were filled up during 2017. Action has also been initiated by KVS for filling up of 4293 teaching posts (Vice Principals – 30, Post Graduate Teachers -1116, Trained Graduate Teachers-2862, Head Masters – 285) through Limited Departmental Examination (LDE). In addition, a Special Recruitment Drive for filling up 546 vacancies of teaching staff of North Eastern Zone has also been conducted during December, 2017. For the year 2017-18 also, KVS has taken advance action for filling up the existing as well as anticipated vacancies through Direct Recruitment/LDE as the case may be.

(c) As on date, 7885 teaching posts are vacant in KVS.

Dues of Madarasa teachers
