Making e-NAM platform more user-friendly

2405. SHRI MOHD. ALI KHAN: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that several new features have been added to National Agriculture Market (e-NAM) platform to make it more user-friendly, if so, the details thereof; and

(b) the number of e-NAM centres presently established and the number of States covered under this facility?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE (SHRI GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT): (a) Yes, Sir. To make e-NAM platform more user-friendly, the Government on 21.02.2018 has rolled out new features in e-NAM platform such as MIS Dashboard for better Analysis, BHIM payment facility by traders, mobile payment facility by traders, advanced lot registration facility for farmers through mobile app, facility for farmers to view the progress of e-bidding for their lot, e-Learning module in e-NAM website etc.

(b) As on 12.03.2018, 517 regulated wholesale markets across 15 States and 01 Union Territory have been integrated with e-NAM platform.
