

**14-Points Action Plan at NDC**

2640. SHRI RAMDAS AGARWAL: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the issue of food security was discussed at the meeting of the National Development Council held in May, 2007 in New Delhi;

(b) whether the Prime Minister announced that farm sector will get a Rs. 25,000 crores booster from the Centre over four years and Government's target of agriculture growth will be 4 per cent;

(c) whether NDC also discussed 14-points Action Plan for Centre/States; and

(d) if so, whether Government have spelt out in detail the concrete steps required to be taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTI LAL BHURIA): (a) to (c) The National Development Council, in its 53rd meeting held on 29th May, 2007 under the Chairmanship of the Prime Minister, reaffirmed its commitment to achieve 4 per cent annual growth in the agricultural sector during XI Plan and resolve for 14 steps to be taken by the Central and the State Governments which, among others, included launching a Food Security Mission and a new Additional Central Assistance Scheme.

(d) The Government has approved a Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'National Food Security Mission' (NFSM) to enhance the production of rice, wheat and pulses by 10, 8 and 2 million tones, respectively by the year 2011-12. Besides, a new scheme Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) has also been approved with an outlay of Rs. 25,000 crores during Eleventh Five Year Plan for holistic development of agriculture and allied sectors in the country.

**Demand and supply of milk**

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI TASLIMUDDIN): (a) to (c) No Sir, the milk production at national level is by and large sufficient to meet the domestic demand of milk and milk products. Government regularly reviews the milk situation in the country & takes appropriate action to ensure availability of adequate quantity of milk to consumers at reasonable price.
