(d) and (e) Government of India has been supplementing the efforts of the State Governments for abatement of pollution in identified stretches of various rivers under the scheme of National River Conservation Plan (NRCP), on a cost sharing basis between the Central and State Governments. NRCP (excluding Ganga and its tributaries) has so far covered polluted stretches of 33 rivers in 76 towns spread over 15 States in the country at a sanctioned cost of ₹4801.57 crore and Central share of ₹2337.73 crore has been released to the State Governments for implementation of various pollution abatement schemes. Sewage treatment capacity of 2520.43 Million Litres Per Day (Mid) has been created so far under the NRCP.

In context of river Ganga, Government have issued a Gazette notification dated 10th October 2018, wherein minimum environmental flows have been notified that is to be maintained in river Ganga from its origin to Unnao (Uttar Pradesh) specifically at locations downstream of structures of projects meant for diversion of river flows for purposes like irrigation, hydropower, domestic and industrial and other requirements.

World Bank assistance for Atal Bhujal Yojana

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES, RIVER DEVELOPMENT AND GANGA REJUVENATION (SHRI ARJUN RAM MEGHWAL): (a) to (e) The World Bank has approved Atal Bhujal Yojana (ABHY), a ₹ 6000 Crore scheme, for sustainable management of ground water with community participation. The funding pattern is 50:50 between Government of India and World Bank. The identified over-exploited and water stressed areas for the implementation of the scheme fall in the States of Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. The scheme envisages active participation of the communities in various activities such as formation of 'Water User Associations', monitoring and disseminating ground water data, water budgeting, preparation and implementation of Gram-Panchayat wise water security plans and IEC activities related to sustainable ground water management.
