Budget for educational upliftment of minorities

†*272. SHRI AHMAD ASHFAQUE KARIM: Will the Minister of MINORITY AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the enhancement made in the budget allocation by Government since 2014 till date in comparison to budget allocation made from 2009 to 2014 for the educational upliftment of minority communities;

(b) the extent to which Government of India has implemented 15-point programme for the welfare of minority communities, in percentage; and

(c) the details of all works done under 15-point programme, point-wise?

THE MINISTER OF MINORITY AFFAIRS (SHRI MUKHTAR ABBAS NAQVI):

(a) The budget allocation for educational upliftment of minority communities in respect of Ministry of Minority Affairs which was ₹ 7,017.66 crore during 2009-10 to 2013-14,

has increased to ₹ 11,833.35 crore in the period from 2014-15 to 2018-19; more than 50% of the scholarships have been awarded to minority girls. In addition, projects for several States for minority concentration areas related to educational infrastructure have also been sanctioned under Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram (PMJVK). While, projects worth ₹ 1,889 crore were sanctioned between 2009-10 to 2013-14, a total of ₹ 3,470 crore projects have been approved during 2014-15 to 2018-19. The restructured PMJVK provides for earmarking of at least 33-40% projects for creation of assets/facilities for women/girls.

(b) and (c) A number of schemes/initiatives for the welfare of minority communities are being implemented by various Ministries/Departments of the Central Government. Schemes implemented by the Ministry of Minority Affairs are exclusively for the welfare of Centrally notified six minority communities (Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains and Parsis) and also schemes implemented by other Ministries/Departments wherever possible. There are a total of 15 points included in the programme as indicated below:—
