

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) whether any specialized agency has been created which would help the poor marginal farmers to derive maximum intended advantages?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTILAL BHURIA): (a) Based on the recommendations of National Agricultural Technology Project on agricultural research, detailed guidelines have been issued for implementation of National Agricultural Innovation Project.

(b) The guidelines are contained in the publications: project implementation plan and financial management manual.

(c) Under one of the important components of National Agricultural Innovation Project, namely Research on Sustainable Rural Livelihood Security (SRLS), consortia are being formed who are developing projects which will help the poor/marginal farmers to derive maximum intended advantages.

Committee on bringing reform in agriculture

11. SHRI JAI PARKASH AGGARWAL: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether farmers get around 30 per cent portion of the final price of agricultural product and the remaining 70 per cent portion is received by middlemen brokers and stockist agents;

(b) if so, whether Government have taken any steps to constitute a high level committee to bring about reform in agriculture and economic sectors related thereto; and

(c) if so, by when the report of this committee is likely to be received?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI KANTILAL BHURIA): (a) The share of farmers in final price of agricultural products depends upon the types of marketing channels followed in sales by the farmers. Studies conducted by the Department of Agriculture indicate that the share of farmers varies from 62% to 84% in rice and wheat, from 67% to 85% in pulses, 59% to 89% in groundnut oil and 33% to 75% in case of fruit and vegetables.

(b) and (c) To examine the problems facing Indian agriculture and to suggest Action Plans, National Development Council (NDC) Sub-Committee on Agricultural Related Issues was constituted by the NDC in June 2005. The Sub-Committee had constituted various Working Groups covering areas such as Region/Crop Specific Productivity Analysis; Irrigation and Minor Irrigation; Dryland/Rainfed Farming, Marketing Reforms etc. In the 53rd meeting of the NDC held on 29th May, 2007, the Report of the Sub-Committee was considered by the NDC and it was resolved to undertake the required steps by the Central and State Governments.
