

**New Kendriya Vidyalayas in Rajasthan**

† 156. DR. PRABHA THAKUR: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received any proposal for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas in Rajasthan from the State Government; if so, the details thereof;

(b) whether Government propose to open some new Kendriya Vidyalayas in the State during the current financial year; and

(c) if so, the details of places earmarked for this purpose and by when these Vidyalayas are planned to be set up?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) Yes, Sir. 6 proposals have been received by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan from the State Government of Rajasthan for opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas at the following places:-
