THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIMATI ANUPRIYA PATEL): (a) and (b) The National Family Health Surveys (NFHSs) are conducted periodically under the stewardship of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India to generate data on important demographic and health indicators (including indicators on Child Health). The first round of NFHS was conducted in 1992-93 followed by NFHS-2 in 1998-99 and NFHS-3 in 2005-06. In addition to NFHS, the Ministry had also been conducting District Level Household and Facility Survey (DLHS) with varying periodicity.

The Ministry, to meet the requirement of National, State and District level information to monitor performance of health programmes/schemes at closer interval, had taken a decision to conduct one integrated survey with a periodicity of approximately three years in place of different surveys of similar nature (National Family Health Survey, District Level Household and Facility Survey etc.) being carried out by the Ministry.

The findings of NFHS-4 are also available in the public domains.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY): (a) and (b) This Ministry administers a Centrally Sponsored Scheme for 'Establishment of new medical colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals' which aims to redress regional imbalances in the availability of medical colleges in the country. Under Phase-I of the scheme, 58 districts in 20 States/UT have been identified to establish new Medical Colleges attached with existing district/referral hospitals. Gujarat is not covered under this Scheme. Further, under Phase-II of this Scheme, an analysis was done to ensure the availability of at least one medical college for every 3 Parliamentary Constituencies and at least 1 Government Medical College in each State of the country. Accordingly, mapping was done and requirement of 24 new medical colleges under Phase-II of the Scheme has been identified. During analysis, no such block (consisting of 3 Parliamentary Constituencies) has been identified in Gujarat State.

As per section 10A of Indian Medical Council (IMC) Act, 1956 and section 10A of Dentists Act, 1948, State Government or Union Territory administration/ a University/ an Autonomous body/a Society/a Public Religious or Charitable Trust may apply to the Central Government for Establishment a new Medical/ Dental colleges within the prescribed Time Schedule contained in the Medical Council of India (MCI)/Dental Council of India (DCI) Regulations. One (1) proposal for establishment of new Dental College and three (03) proposals for establishment of new Medical Colleges in the State of Gujarat have been received in the Ministry for the academic session 2019-20 and all the proposals/applications have been forwarded to MCI/DCI for appropriate recommendations. In the meantime the MCI was superseded by Board of Governors (BOG) on 26th September, 2018 through an Ordinance and powers under section 10A of IMC Act, 1956 have been delegated to BOG-MCI. Now granting permission in respect of establishment of new medical colleges/increase of intake capacity in existing medical colleges/renewal of permission are being undertaken by BoG-MCI.

(c) There are twenty six (26) Medical Colleges with total intake of 4150 seats and thirteen (13) Dental colleges with total intake of 1240 seats running in the State of Gujarat and the details are given in the Statement-I and Statement-II respectively.
