

Shortage of Engineering Teachers

149. SHRIMATI SHOBHANA BHARTIA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether, according to Government guidelines, engineering colleges must have a teacher for every 15 students and going by this ratio, the colleges are short of 72,000 teachers for 2007-08;

(b) whether the National University of Education Planning and Administration, dealing with capacity-building and research in the planning and management of education, blamed the shortage of teachers on the lack of incentives;

(c) if so, whether the technical schools would be 1.3 lakh teachers short by 2011 according to Government panel; and

(d) if so, the steps Government propose to take to meet the shortage?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) As per AICTE norms the ratio of the number of faculty to the number of students in an engineering college needs to be 1:15. An estimate regarding shortfall of faculty in Engineering Colleges was made by Prof. P. Rama Rao Committee. The Committee in its report has projected a shortfall of about 86,000 faculty with Ph.D. and Master Degree in Engineering for the year 2007-08.

(b) As per the information furnished by National University of Education Planning and Administration (NUEPA), there is no such research study on this issue.

(c) For the year 2010-11, Prof. P. Rama Rao Committee report has estimated a shortfall of 1,33,762 faculty with Ph.D. and Master Degree in Engineering.

(d) The Rama Rao Committee on "Faculty Development in Technical Institutions" has recommended several action points for Faculty development. Subject to the *availability of funds during the XIth Five Year Plan, these recommendations will be implemented*. Ministry of HRD has enhanced the age of superannuation of Teacher in Centrally Funded Institutions of Higher and Technical Education from 62 years to 65 years.
