Threat of global warming

†137. SHRI JAI PARKASH AGGARWAL: Will the Minister of EARTH SCIENCES be pleased to state:

(a) whether there was any consensus among international delegation in Bangkok on 4th May 2007 that to face the threat of global warming, the harmful effects of emission of green house gases should be curbed;

(b) whether there was also any consensus on the report of international panel on climate changes in this meeting, in which it was stressed to take immediate steps to lessen the increase of 2 degree Celcius temperature all over the world; and

(c) if so, the steps taken so far to face the global warming in the country?

THE MINISTER OF EARTH SCIENCES (SHRI KAPIL SIBAL): (a) No, Sir. Inter-Governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is not a forum to evolve consensus on the need or otherwise to take action for curbing the emission of green house gases.

However, the IPCC approved the Fourth Assessment Report, of its Working Group III on MITIGATION OF CLIMATE CHANGE at a meeting on 4th May 2007 at Bangkok, Thailand, written by about 168 authors by peer reviewing the scientific findings.
