## Work on Rewa-Sidhi-Churhat railway project

†745. SHRI AJAY PRATAP SINGH: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the work on Rewa-Sidhi-Churhat project in Madhya Pradesh is in progress;
- (b) if so, the detailed information of the administrative and financial expenditure incurred on the project; and
- (c) the current status of the work completed on this project and by when it is targeted to be completed?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAJEN GOHAIN): (a) to (c) Construction of new line from Rewa-Churhat-Sidhi (87 km.) section has been taken up as a part of Lalitpur-Satna, Rewa-Singrauli and Mahoba-Khajuraho (541 km.) new line project. An expenditure of ₹ 1603.89 crore has been incurred in the entire project upto March, 2018 and an outlay of ₹ 315 crore has been provided for the year 2018-19.

Earthwork, bridges work, ballast supply, construction of Road over Bridge/Road under Bridge, station building etc. in Rewa-Sidhi section are in different stages of execution.

Completion of the project is dependent upon many factors such as land acquisition, shifting of services, cutting of trees etc. Since many of these factors are beyond the control of Ministry of Railways, timeline for completion of the project is not feasible to be fixed.

## Unmanned level crossings

- (a) whether as on date, Government has completed the work of eliminating all the unmanned level crossings;
- (b) if so, the details of unmanned level crossings eliminated during the last three years, State-wise; and
- (c) if not, the number of unmanned level crossings still existing in the country, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAJEN GOHAIN): (a) Railways have decided to eliminate unmanned level crossings (UMLCs)

from Broad Gauge (BG) track across the country and accordingly work of eliminating UMLCs on BG has been completed. So far as elimination of UMLCs on Meter Gauge (MG) and Narrow Gauge (NG) is concerned, it has been planned to eliminate them during gauge conversion.

The works have already started; completion of the same depends upon availability of funds in coming years.
