

Death of tigers

813. SHRI ANIL DESAI: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that tiger death cases have increased recently in the country;

(b) if so, details for the last three years, State-wise;

(c) whether there has been a nexus between influential persons, poachers and forest rangers responsible for causing death of tigers; and

(d) if so, the number of persons arrested during the same period?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (DR. MAHESH SHARMA): (a) and (b) No Sir. There were fewer tiger deaths in 2018 as compared to 2017. The State-wise details of tiger deaths during the years 2016, 2017 and 2018, as reported by States, are given in the Statement (*See below*).

(c) No evidences are available on record proving a nexus between influential persons, poachers and forest rangers for causing death of tigers.

(d) Question does not arise.

Projects for promoting adaptation activities on climate change

†814. SHRI PRABHAT JHA: Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Central projects are running for promoting adaptation activities in several States of country under National Adaptation Fund on Climate Change;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether the work progress made so far under these projects is commensurate with the target; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE (DR. MAHESH SHARMA): (a) and (b) 27 projects to support climate change adaptation measures in agriculture, water, forestry, infrastructure sectors etc. have been approved under the scheme at a sanctioned cost of ₹ 673.65 crores. Most of the projects are of long-term duration ranging between 3-5 years.

(c) and (d) All the sanctioned projects are currently under implementation and will achieve their targets as per the reports from the National Implementing Entity.
