Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL). Shares of IOCL constitute a part of the CPSE ETF and Bharat 22 ETF index. Alternative Mechanism (AM) in April, 2017 has also approved for disinvestment of 3% share of IOCL through offer of sale.

Skill development for unemployed youth

1220. SHRI HARNATH SINGH YADAV: SHRI VIJAY PAL SINGH TOMAR: SHRI P. BHATTACHARYA:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the schemes currently being run by Government for skill development of the unemployed youth in urban and rural areas of the country; and
- (b) the number of people benefited with these schemes during the last two years along with the number of youth provided with avenue of employment?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI ANANTKUMAR HEGDE): (a) and (b) Under Skill India Mission, the Government of India is implementing around 40 programmes through more than 20 Central Ministries/Departments for skill development. Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) is implementing schemes for imparting employable skills to the youth through short term and long term program. The Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) implemented by MSDE provides short term training to the youth through affiliated training partners/training centres, both in urban and rural areas. Long term training is provided through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs). There are 15044 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) functioning in the country affiliated with National Council of Vocational Training which provide training to 26.43 Lakhs students. Under PMKVY 2016-20, 29.66 Lakhs persons have been trained during the last two years. The Directorate General of Training under Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is also providing various vocational/skill training programs through a network of 15 National Skill Training Institutes (NSTIs) and 18 National Skill Training Institutes (Women) (NSTIs-W) in various urban and rural areas of the country. The trainees trained by the NSTIs during 2016-17 are 27410 and during 2017-18 are 29345 trainees.

In addition, Ministry of Rural Development is running Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) scheme for rural areas in which 1.13 Lakhs and

Ministry of Housing and Urabn Affairs is running a programme Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM) for urban areas in which 2.48 Lakhs and 3.98 Lakhs have been trained during the year 2017-18 and 2018-19 respectively.

Skill development training camps in Karnataka

1221. SHRI SYED NASIR HUSSAIN: Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of skill development training camps in various States particularly in Karnataka under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), the State-wise details thereof;
- (b) the target numbers and the total number of candidates trained during each of the last three years and the current year, the State-wise details thereof;
- (c) the details of the total placements provided to the youth trained through the skill development programmes, the State- wise details thereof; and
- (d) the dropout rate of the students taking skill development training under the programme, the State-wise details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI ANANTKUMAR HEGDE): (a) to (d) Under Skill India Mission, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is implementing a flagship scheme known as Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) with an objective to provide skilling to one crore people under Short Term Training (STT), Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Special Project (SP) across the country including State of Karnataka for four years *i.e.* 2016-2020.

Under STT and SP, training is being imparted in accredited and affiliated training centres. Also, under RPL, there is a provision of orientation in camp mode for recognition and certification of existing skills. Under the scheme, the accreditation and affiliation of training centres are being done through a single window application SMART for imparting skill development training. As on 24.01.2019, 10,355 TCs have been empanelled under PMKVY 2016-20. Further, under PMKVY 2016-20, as on 24.01.2019, 37.32 lakh (appx.) candidates have been trained under STT (25.25 lakh), RPL (11.27 lakh) and Special Project (0.8 lakh) in the country. Additionally, PMKVY 2016-20 scheme has mandatory provisions for placement tracking. The placement data is reported within 90
