operational (Bhopal, Indore, Jabalpur, Khajuraho and Gwalior (CE)) and 03 are nonoperational (Panna, Satna and Khandwa). The current capacity of the airports is as under:

Bhopal 2.5 MPPA (Million Passengers Per Annum). Indore 4 MPPA. Jabalpur 0.12 MPPA. Khajuraho 1.5 MPPA. Gwalior (CE) 0.16 MPPA.

Development/expansion of airports is a continuous process and is undertaken by Airports Authority of India (AAI) and concerned private operators from time to time depending on the availability of land, commercial viability, socio-economic considerations, traffic demand / willingness of airlines to operate to/from such airports. AAI has initiated action for construction of ATC Tower cum Technical Block at Raja Bhoj Airport in Bhopal, development of 15 parking bays, parallel taxi-track and New Domestic Terminal Building at Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar Airport in Indore and construction of New Terminal Building and ATC tower cum Technical block at Jabalpur Airport Work has also been awarded for construction of ATC Tower at Khajura no Airport.

At present, the scheduled flight services from operational airports in Madhya Pradesh are available on following routes:-

- 1. Bhopal: Delhi, Mumbai, Raipur, Lucknow, Jaipur
- 2. Indore: Ahmedabad, Bagdogra, Bangalore, Mumbai, Kolkata, Delhi, Goa, Gwalior, Hyderabad,, Allahabad, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Lucknow, Chennai, Nagpur, Pune, Raipur
- 3. Jabalpur: Ahmedabad, Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Kolkata
- 4. Khajuraho: Varanasi, Agra
- 5. Gwalior: Delhi, Indore, Mumbai.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAYANT SINHA): (a) to (c) No such proposal is under consideration.

- (d) Details of flights cancelled and delayed airlines during the period 2016, 2017 and 2018 is given in Statement-I (*See* below). Generally, flights are operated as per published schedule. However, at times, flights are delayed and even cancelled due to operational, technical, weather and commercial reasons.
- (e) Number of passengers affected due to cancellation and delays during period 2016, 2017 and 2018 is given in Statement-II (*See* below).
- (f) Amount spent by the airlines on facilitations and compensations due to delays and cancellation during period 2016, 2017 and 2018 is given in Statement-III (*See* below).

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAYANT SINHA): (a) and (b) Expansion/upgradation/modernisation of airports is a continuous process and is undertaken by Airports Authority of India (AAI) and concerned private operators from time to time depending on the availability of land, commercial viability, socio-economic considerations, traffic demand/willingness of airlines to operate to/from such airports. To meet the demand, AAI has embarked upon a Capital Expenditure (CAPEX) plan of ₹ 25,000 crores in next 4-5 years for development/ modernisation/upgradation of terminal buildings of AAI airports in the country including Calicut in Kerala, Port Blair in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Agartala in Tripura,
