THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ATOMIC ENERGY (DR. JITENDRA SINGH): (a) No, Sir. Equity investment by Government of India in production of atomic energy is sufficient.

- (c) and (d) As regards domestic investment, the Finance Minister in his budget speech in Lok Sabha on 29.02.2016 had stated "Government is drawing up a comprehensive plan, spanning next 15 to 20 years, to augment the investment in nuclear power generation. Budgetary allocation up to f 3,000 crore per annum, together with public sector investments, will be leveraged to facilitate the required investment for this purpose."

There is no proposal to promote Foreign Direct Investment in nuclear power generation as the present policy (Consolidated FDI Policy of Government) puts atomic energy in the list of prohibited sectors.
