Storage benefit to Rajasthan

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SHRI DANVE RAOSAHEB DADARAO): (a) to (c) Government of India reimburses storage charges as a part of food subsidy. At the time of reimbursement of provisional food subsidy to Decentralized procurement (DCP) States, storage charges are reimbursed for the period of 15 days for acquisition and 5.5 months for distribution of wheat at the rate prescribed in Provisional Cost Sheet (PCS).

In the PCS of Rabi Marketing Season 2019-20, the storage charges for CAP storage is allowed at the rate of ₹ 2.40/quintal/month and for Covered storage at the rate of ₹ 9.36/quintal/month. The quantum of storage charges varies from year to year and State to State depending upon the quantity of wheat procured under MSP operations and distributed under National Food Security Act (NFSA) and OWS (Other Welfare Schemes).

(d) and (e) No such request has been received in the Department from Government of Rajasthan.

Starvation deaths in Jharkhand due to denial of ration
