Public Distribution System (PDS), and to re-organize PDS based on the zonal diversities of the country.

Presently, there are around 5.3 lakh Fair Price Shops across the country which are distributing subsidised foodgrains to the beneficiaries as per NFSA norms.

Most of the schemes/programmes have a pan India focus and State/Union Territory(UT) wise allocations are not made under these schemes. Details of funds allocated, released and spent/unspent funds for various schemes of this Department during the last three years are given in the Statement-I (See below).

### Procurement of farm produces at MSP by private players

3096. SHRI V. VIJAYASAI REDDY: Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Ministry has approved a new scheme for procuring farm produces at MSP by private players;
- (b) if so, the reasons for permitting private players and how it helps in smooth distribution through PDS; and
- (c) the amount that has been earmarked for the year 2018-19 for the new procurement mechanism?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SHRI DANVE RAOSAHEB DADARAO): (a) and (b) To give special focus to increase the spread of MSP operation in eastern states, private players for procurement of paddy/rice were engaged in Jharkhand, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh during KMS 2015-16 to KMS 2017-18.

Further, in order to ensure remunerative prices to farmers for their produce, Private Procurement and Stockist Scheme (PPSS) under Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay SanraksHan Abhiyan' (PM-AASHA) has been launched in October, 2018. The objective of PPSS is to assess the workability of private agencies in the procurement operation at MSP. The Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers Welfare (DAC&FW), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare is implementing the PPSS scheme for procurement of oilseeds.
