SHRI RAJMANI PATEL:

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state the number of routes which are being given subsidy or are subsidised under UDAN scheme and the number of airports which have been waived off from airport charges under UDAN scheme, so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI): Government has launched Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) on 21.10.2016 to stimulate regional air connectivity by making it affordable. Promoting affordability of regional air connectivity is envisioned under RCS by supporting Selected Airline Operators (SAOs) through concession by Central Government, State Governments/UTs and airport operators to reduce the cost of airline operations on regional routes and financial support (Viability Gap Funding or VGF) to meet the gap, if any, between the cost of airline operations and expected revenues on such RCS routes. Central Government and State Governments share Viability Gap Funding (VGF) in the ratio of 80:20 whereas for the States in North-Eastern region/Union Territories (UTs) the ratio is 90:10.

Various concessions provided by the airport operators concerned under RCS inter-alia are as follows:-

(i) Airport operators do not levy landing charges and parking charges.

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- (ii) Selected Airline Operators are allowed to undertake ground handling for their RCS Flights at all airports.
- (iii) Airports Authority of India (AAI) does not levy any Terminal Navigation Landing Charges (TNLC) on RCS Flights.
- (iv) Route Navigation and Facilitation Charges (RNFC) are levied by AAI on a discounted basis @ 42.50% of normal rates on RCS flights.

Airports Authority of India (AAI), being the Implementing Agency, has conducted three rounds of bidding under the scheme. Under RCS - UDAN, 688 RCS routes have been awarded by the Implementing Agency. Out of which, 232 RCS routes involving 43 unserved and underserved RCS Airports have been commenced so far. Details of 43 unserved and underserved RCS airports where RCS operations have started are given in the Statement. [Refer to the Statement-II appended to the answer to vs Q.No. 2561 (Part (a) to (c)]

- (a) whether any action has been taken by Government in the construction and speeding up the process of authorisation of Jewar International Airport in Jewar, Uttar Pradesh and what advancements and approvals are being given by DGCA to speed-up the airport construction in Jewar, Uttar Pradesh; and
 - (b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI): (a) and (b) Government of India, Ministry of Civil Aviation has granted 'in-principle' approval to Government of Uttar Pradesh (GoUP) for construction of new Greenfield airport at Jewar, Uttar Pradesh. GoUP appointed Yamuna Expressway Industrial Development Authority (YEIDA) as the implementing agency for the project. YEIDA has informed that the financial bids for development of Noida International Airport have been opened and Zurich Airport International AG has been declared as the highest bidder. As per the Greenfield Airport Policy, 2008, subsequent to grant of 'in-principle' approval to an airport project, all responsibilities regarding execution of the project lie with the project proponent, *i.e.* GoUP in the case of Jewar Airport Project.
