## Shelter homes to urban homeless

\*253. PROF. MANOJ KUMAR JHA: Will the Minister of HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the reasons for delay and denial of shelter homes to the urban homeless;
- (b) the State-wise details of shelters for the homeless functional in the country;
- (c) the city-wise details of shelter homes constructed by Government during last three years;
- (d) the initiatives taken by Government to ensure access to basic services, specifically for the urban homeless;
- (e) whether there is a special provision for special shelters for marginal categories of homeless people like children, mentally ill and drug-addicts; and
  - (f) if so, the State-wise details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS (SHRI HARDEEP SINGH PURI): (a) to (c) It is the primary responsibility of respective Governments of the States/Union Territories to provide shelters for the urban homeless. However, in order to complement their efforts, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is administering a scheme 'Shelter for Urban Homeless' (SUH) under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM), through respective States/UTs. The guidelines of SUH prescribe systematic third party surveys to be undertaken in cities/towns by the urban local bodies in order to assess the need for shelters at suitable locations.

As per the information received from the States/UTs, as on 30.11.2019, 1348 shelters are functional under DAY-NULM. Of these, 880 shelters have been made functional during last three years i.e. from FY 2016-17 to FY 2018-19. The State and city-wise details are given in Statement-I (*See* below).

(d) The shelters established under SUH are equipped with basic facilities such as ventilated rooms, standard lighting, potable drinking water, toilet facilities, personal locker, regular cleaning of blankets and mattresses, cooking facilities, linkages to

various social security benefits and periodical health check-up. Further, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has issued advisories to States to install Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras at entry and exit points, geo-tagging of shelters, appointment of student volunteers of nearby educational institutions and ensuring barrier free entrance for differently abled.

(e) and (f) The operational guidelines of SUH provide that States/ULBs may establish special shelters for certain segments of homeless persons *viz.* old persons, mentally or physically challenged, recovering patients and their families, and attendants of the patients admitted in hospitals, etc. As reported by states/UTs, so far 85 special shelters have been established. The details are given in Statement-II.
