## Developing Ganga river as inland waterway

Wilt the Minister of SHIPPING be pleased to state:
(a) whether Government is developing Ganga river as inland waterway;
(b) if so, the details of steps being taken and expenditure incurred thereon; and
(c) whether Government proposes to operate Ro-Ro Ferry and Ro-Pax Ferry on the said National Waterway and if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING (SHRI MANSUKH MANDAVIYA): (a) and (b) Government is implementing the Jal Marg Vikas Project (JMVP) at an estimated cost of ₹ 5369.18 crore for capacity augmentation of navigation on the Haldia-Varanasi stretch of Ganga-Bhagirathi-Hooghly river system (National Waterway-1) with the technical and financial assistance of the World Bank. Projects worth ₹ 1800 crore (approx.) have commenced on ground in a time period of three years after statutory clearances and an expenditure of ₹ 1447.43 crore has been incurred up to 31.10.2019.
(c) No, Sir. However, the interventions in JMVP include five pairs of Ro-Ro terminals at Rajmahal (Jharkhand)-Manikchak (West Bengal), Samdaghat (Jharkhand)Manihari (Bihar), Kahalgaon-Tintangha (Bihar), Hasnapur-Bakhtiyarpur (Bihar), Buxar (Bihar)-Saraikota (Uttar Pradesh).
