## Low spending on sports

955. SHRI RITABRATA BANERJEE: Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government spending on sports is far less than the Asian countries like Japan, South Korea and China; and
  - (b) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI KIREN RIJIJU): (a) and (b) Spending on sports in different countries depends on the stage of development of different sports in the concerned country. Sports being a State subject the primary responsibility for development and promotion of sports rests with the State/UT Governments. Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports supplements efforts of the State/UT Governments and supports athletes for training and competitions at national and international events. The budget allocation for the current financial year is ₹1600 crore for the Department of Sports as against an expenditure of ₹ 1297.38 crores in the previous financial year.

## Khelo India Programme

956. PROF. M.V. RAJEEV GOWDA: Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of State level Khelo India Centres established;
- (b) details of rural/indigenous sports which Government has promoted;
- (c) the details of financial support given to National/Regional/State sports academies;
- (d) the details of sports competition sponsored/organised under the aegis of 'Khelo India' programme; and
- (e) the details of talented players identified in priority sports disciplines at various levels and annual financial assistance given to them?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI KIREN RIJIJU): (a) The existing 46 SAI Training Centres (STCs) are being supported under "State Level Khelo India Centre (SLKIC)" vertical of Khelo India scheme. The list of 46 established centres is given in the Statement-I (*See* below).

- (b) Indigenous sports such as Kho Kho, Kabaddi, Mallakhamb, Kalaripayattu, Gatkaand Thang-Ta are being supported by the Ministry of Youth Affair and Sports. Last year 23 sports events were held in Rural and Indigenous Games at 23 different locations across the country as part of the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' programme. In these events about 1500 players participated. These disciplines included Sqay, Kho-Kho, Kalaripayattu, Mallakhamb and Roll Ball. Under the Fit India Movement, all State/UT Governments have been advised to encourage all schools to provide for regular sports, including a local/indigenous game, by all students.
- (c) An amount of ₹ 156.83 crore has been provided to various National/Regional/ State sports academies under Khelo India Scheme.
- (d) Under the aegis of 'Khelo India' programme, the 1st Khelo India School Games (KISG) 2018 were conducted in 2018 at New Delhi with participation of 3507 athletes. The 2nd edition of Games, *i.e.* 'Khelo India Youth Games, 2019' were conducted in Pune in 2019 with participation of 5925 athletes. Competitions for mentally challenged athletes were also organized through Special Olympic Bharat in 2018.
- (e) A total of 2741 young athletes in 24 sports disciplines (including Para sports) have been identified under the Talent Search and Development vertical of Khelo India Scheme. Out of 2741 identified athletes, 1388 athletes opted for residential/day-boarding training at accredited academies under Khelo India. This Ministry bears the

full expenditure of these athletes. Remaining athletes opted for training with their own arrangement and are being given maximum Out of Pocket Allowances @ ₹ 10,000. State wise details of number of athletes receiving training in these academies is given in the Statement-II.
