(b) and (c) The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises implements "Interest Subvention Scheme for MSMEs" on fresh or incremental loans for all GST registered MSMEs. As per information received from SIDBI, ₹ 423.23 crore has been released as on January 27, 2020.

THE MINISTER OF MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI): (a) and (b) The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises implements various schemes for promotion and development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) across the country. These include Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), A Scheme for Promoting Innovation, Rural Industry and Entrepreneurship (ASPIRE), Credit Guarantee Scheme, Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Scheme (CLCSS), Technology Centre Systems Programme (TCSP), Micro and Small Enterprise- Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP), etc.

(c) The Government allocates funds under various schemes and programmes for promotion and development of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) across the country. The funds are not allocated State-wise as all the schemes of the Ministry of MSME are Central Sector Schemes (CSSs). However, the details of the budget allocation for the Ministry of MSME for the FY 2018-19 and 2019-20 are given below:

(d) Ministry of MSME regularly carries out review, monitoring, impact assessment and evaluation of Schemes/Programmes/Projects implemented by it. The MSME-Development Institutes under the Ministry of MSME, GOI, located in the States provide necessary hand-holding support to the MSMEs and their Associations in obtaining help and support not only from the schemes run by the Ministry of MSME but also from other agencies like banks and even the State Governments concerned.
