Providing drinking water to all

- †89. DR. SATYANARAYAN JATIYA: Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:
- (a) the details of policy and programme for providing drinking water to all; and
- (b) measures taken for its supply and the estimate of financial resource required in its implementation and the target in the coming five years, year-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF JAL SHAKTI (SHRI RATTAN LAL KATARIA): (a) Government of India, in partnership with the States/UTs, has launched Jal Jeevan Mission which aims at providing potable water to every rural household through Functional Household Tap Connection (FHTC) at the service level of 55 litre per capita per day (Ipcd) by 2024.

(b) Rural drinking water supply being a State subject, Government of India supplements the efforts of States/ UTs by providing them with financial and technical assistance.

After the launch of JJM, a conference of Minister in-charge of rural water supply of various States was held in New Delhi, followed by five regional workshops to discuss the modalities of the implementation of the Mission. Moreover, in consultation with State Governments and other stakeholders in water sector, Operational Guidelines for the implementation of the Mission has been released on 25.12.2019.

A budgetary allocation of $\ref{10,000.66}$ crore has been made for JJM for the financial year 2019-20 and as on 29.01.2020, an amount of $\ref{6,433.61}$ crore has been released to the States/ UTs.
