New map released by Pakistan

MURALEEDHARAN): (a) to (d) On 4 August 2020, a so-called 'political map' of Pakistan was unveiled by its Prime Minister making absurd assertions and laying untenable claims to territories in the Indian State of Gujarat and our Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh

Government has rejected Pakistan's obsession with territorial aggrandisement supported by cross border terrorism. It has also been emphasized that Pakistan should desist from laying untenable claims to Indian territories, which have neither legal validity nor international credibility.
