Acquiring of fertile land for NTPC plant in Barauni, Bihar

It relates to saving the livelihood of hundreds of farmers in Bihar. It is about NTPC plant at Barauni in Bihar, which needed land for taking out the waste of the coal plant. That said land is available next to the NTPC plant which is about ten metres. Hundreds of acres are infertile and barren. Instead, in its own wisdom, the Bihar State Government, allocated them 290 acres of land, five kilometres away from the plant, which is highly fertile and which should not have been taken over, and our hon. Prime Minister's view is that fertile land should not be taken for non-agriculture purpose. So, this matter should be taken up with the State Government.
