(d) There is no specific fixed interval prescribed as such but random surprise inspection can be carried out based on recommendation of the Appraisal Committee/Hearing Committee or receipt of complaint etc.

Evaluation methods for additional seats in courses

1544. DR. K. KESHA RAO: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the evaluation method in granting additional seats to professional courses like MBA, MCA and engineering;

(b) whether any discrepancies have been found in evaluation, exposing favouritism and corruption;

(c) whether any criterion is adopted for granting such additional seats; and

(d) if so, whether views of the State Governments or their agencies have been taken into consideration?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): As per information furnished by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the complete procedure, prescribed format and broad guidelines for processing proposal for additional seats for an application are available at AICTE website (www.aicte.ernet.in). A Detailed Project Report is also submitted by every institution. Increase in intake is approved with a condition that all additional facilities should be provided for increased intake and the same can be verified through surprise inspection.

(d) Proposals for new institution are duly forwarded by AICTE to the respective State Government and affiliating University for comments. The views of the State Government or their agencies are considered by AICTE at the time of giving approval.

Virtual classes through EDUSAT

†1545. SHRIMATI SUSHMA SWARAJ: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether any scheme has been formulated to arrange lectures for the college students in rural and tribal areas as virtual class through EDUSAT;

(b) if so, the details of amount sanctioned for this purpose, State-wise; and

(c) the number of colleges of Madhya Pradesh included in this scheme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) Government has no specific

scheme for delivering virtual lectures through EDUSAT. However, some organizations such as IGNOU etc. are, *inter-alia*, making use of EDUSAT facilities for delivery of virtual lectures for students across the country including rural and tribal areas.

(b) and (c) Do not arise.

Open learning system

1546. SHRIMATI SUPRIYA SULE: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the open learning system can help spread literacy;

(b) whether the Constitution implies right to access quality education in an equitable manner, and this can be attained primarily through open and distance learning system;

(c) whether Government are considering to open more open universities to provide education to all;

(d) if so, whether a number of initiatives have been taken to provide effective facilities, intellectual and knowledge resources in colleges, convergence between conventional university system and the open and distance learning; and

(e) if so, to what extent the facilities of these projects have helped in strengthening literacy in the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MD. ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) Though open learning system does not directly spread literacy, it can encourage people to become literate and go on to get certifications for Class III, Class V and higher.

(b) The 86th Amendment to the Constitution provides for free and compulsory education to all the children in the age group of 6 - 14 years. Open and distance learning system can provide education and equivalence certification with the conventional system of education. It has also helped in imparting training to the teachers with the objective of providing quality education to the children in the above mentioned age group. However, it may not be the primary source of education in the present scenario.

(c) No, Madam. The Central Government is not considering to open more open universities at present.

(d) and (e) Do not arise.
