CSR projects of coal PSUs

2086. DR. KIRODI LAL MEENA:

Will the Minister of **Coal** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Public Sector Undertakings under the Ministry have failed to utilise hundred percent funds allocated for Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects towards the local development, in last five years;
- (b) if so, the quantum of funds allocated and utilised during the period from 2016-17 to till date;
- (c) whether Government has any special budget for infrastructural development in local areas to develop its property, schools, parks, etc through Public Private Partnership (PPP) model; and
- (d) if so, details of such PPP models, area-wise including Dausa district in Rajasthan and details of funds allocated/spent by subsidiary companies from 2016-17 to till date?

(a): Coal India Ltd.(CIL) as well as NLC India Ltd. (NLCIL) along with its subsidiaries have collectively utilized entire Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds allocated in each of the last five years i.e. FY 15-16 to FY 19-20 as per the norms prescribed in section 135 of Companies Act 2013.
