Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether concerned over the high drop out rate of students in rural schools, which have been facing neglect, besides being deprived of basic amenities and infrastructure, the National Council of Educational Research and Training has decided to constitute a rural education cell;
- (b) if so, whether this cell would look into the problems the schools are facing as well as evaluate their performances; and
 - (c) if so, by when, a final decision in this regard is likely to be taken?

 - (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

ALI ASHRAF FATMI): (a) Under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) Programme, funds are sanctioned by the Government of India to State/UT Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan programmes as per an approved Annual Work Plan and Budget (AWP&B). In case there are unfinished works at the end of the year, SSA guidelines permit roll over of such activities as spillovers to the subsequent year.
