RESTRICTIONS ON SHIPPING DUE TO COVID-19

2205. SHRI TIRUCHI SIVA:

Will the Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways be pleased to state:

- (a) the current restrictions on Shipping, to and from the country due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- (b) whether Government has a record of industries that have suffered due to Shipping restrictions over the past year, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a)& (b) There has been no restriction on shipping at any point of time. The Government of India recognizing the role of Shipping in world trade and commerce and in maintaining the logistic supply chain took several steps to ensure continued shipping operations. During the pandemic and national lock-down the port and shipping services were kept functional. Several Orders and Standard Operating Procedures were issued to facilitate crew change at Indian shores/foreign ports and e-passes for their inter and intrastate transits. Due to these pro-active measures, all Indian ships and ports have been kept in functional condition during the pandemic.
