SKILL DEVELOPMENT OF URBAN AND RURAL YOUTHS

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of urban and rural youth who have been trained under the "Skill Development Scheme";
- (b) the number of urban and rural youth who have been provided employment through "Skill Development Scheme";
- (c) the number of people out of those employed, that have been provided with jobs at the local level; and
- (d) the number of people who have completed the skill development programme and have been provided self-employment through "Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana"?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP (SHRI R.K. SINGH)

(a) to (c): The Government is implementing various schemes for providing skill development training to the youth of the country, both in urban and in rural areas. The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) is implementing the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme and the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) for short-term training, and Craftsmen Training Scheme (CTS) through the Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) for long-term training. In addition, the Ministry of Rural Development is implementing Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) and Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETIs) schemes, while the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is implementing the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana- National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM). The number of candidates trained and reported placed under the above schemes since 2016-17 is as under:

(d): The Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY) envisages "funding the unfunded", which includes persons who have availed skill training. It brings the micro enterprises within the formal financial system and extends affordable credit to them, with interventions named 'Shishu' (up to Rs. 50,000/-), 'Kishor' (above Rs. 50,000 up to Rs. 5 lakhs) and 'Tarun' (above Rs. 5 lakhs up to Rs. 10 lakhs) through Banks, Non-Banking Finance Companies and Micro-Finance Institutions. During FY 2019-20, the total sanctions under PMMY was Rs. 3.37 lakh crore, benefiting 6.22 crore beneficiaries.
