Potential of MSMEs in employment generation

Will the Minister of *Micro*, *Small and Medium Enterprises* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) have potential in the sectors such as defence, infrastructure, manufacturing, power, petroleum, coal, mining, ports, airports and many more, which will help to create better Government assets and for better utilization of the same to generate employment opportunities in various sectors through setting and connecting economic corridors/industrial corridors/NHs; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof and progress made and if not, the reasons thereof?

(a) & (b): MSME Sector contributes significantly in the economic and social development of the country by fostering entrepreneurship and generating large employment opportunities at low capital cost. MSMEs operate in all sectors/sub-sectors contributing nearly 30 percent to country's GDP and providing employment to more than 11 crore people.

Ministry of MSME has undertaken various initiatives to enhance manufacturing competitiveness of MSMEs to unleash their true potential by providing access to technology, facilitating access to finance and implement innovative financing options to address capital constraints of MSMEs, promoting inclusive growth by development of rural and village Industries. Further, Ministry is implementing Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) with a special focus to generate employment opportunities in rural and urban areas of the country through setting up of new self-employment ventures / projects / micro enterprises. The scheme also works towards achieving sustainable employment to all segment of traditional and prospective artisans and rural / urban unemployed youth.
