- (a) Whether Government has any plan to directly connect the existing airports in North-Eastern States with airports of major cities of the country with landing and take-off facilities during nights also;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether Government has accorded high priority in implementation of UDAN Scheme in North-Eastern States keeping in view the development and also to increase tourism in the region; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

STATEMENT IN RESPECT OF RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 248
REGARDING "CONNECTIVITY OF AIRPORTS IN NORTH-EASTERN STATES
WITH AIRPORTS OF MAJOR CITIES" TO BE ANSWERED ON 11.08.2021:-

(a) to (d): Ministry of Civil Aviation has accorded high priority to connectivity in North Eastern Regions (NERs). Details of operational airports in NER, connectivity and night landing facilities are provided at Annexure. After repeal of the Air Corporation Act in March 1994, the Indian domestic aviation market was deregulated. Consequently, airlines are free to induct capacity with any aircraft type for selecting whatever markets and network they wish to service and operate across the country subject to compliance with the extant Route Dispersal Guidelines (RDGs) in this regard. As per RDGs, all Scheduled Airline Operators are required to deploy a particular percentage of their capacity in NER compared to their capacity deployed on metro routes.

Thus, it is up to the airlines to provide air services to specific places depending upon the traffic demand and their commercial viability, in compliance with the extant guidelines. However, the Ministry regularly interacts with the stakeholders from time to time with an aim to improve air connectivity.

Further, Ministry of Civil Aviation has launched Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS)- UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) on 21-10-2016 to enhance regional air connectivity from unserved and underserved airports in the country by making air travel affordable to the masses. States of North Eastern Region (NER) have been included in the scheme document as Priority Area(s). So far, 108 UDAN routes including tourism routes have been awarded for operation of UDAN flights in the States of NER. Till date, 44 number of UDAN routes have been operationalized.
