- (a) whether Government is aware that there is reluctance among patients to be treated by AYUSH doctor;
- (b) whether Government has taken steps to conduct surgery and other operations by AYUSH doctors; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof?

(a): No. Such instances have not been experienced by this Ministry so far. There has been an increasing trend in the number of people availing Government Health Care facilities under AYUSH for the last five years as per the data given below:-
