DRINKING WATER FOR EVERY HOUSEHOLD UNDER JJM

87 # DR. KIRODI LAL MEENA:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government has envisioned to provide drinking water through individual household tap connections by 2024 to all households in rural India under 'Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM)', if so, the details thereof, the number of households in rural areas which have been provided drinking water, so far, State-wise; and
- (b) whether Rajasthan Government has raised a demand before Government to increase the latter's share of contribution in view of providing drinking water to every households, in the State under JJM, if so, the steps taken by Government in this regard?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR JAL SHAKTI (SHRI PRAHLAD SINGH PATEL)

- (a) To make provision for potable tap water supply to every rural home through Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTCs) by 2024, Government of India is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) in partnership with States. At the time of launch of Jal Jeevan Mission on 15th August, 2019, out of total 18.94 Crore rural households in the country, 3.23 (17%) crore rural households had tap water connections. Since then, 4.51 Crore (23.79%) rural households have been provided tap water connections thus, as on date, 7.74 Crore (40.88%) rural households have provision of tap water supply. State-wise details is **annexed.**
- (b) Government of India had received a request from the Government of Rajasthan to increase the Central share under Jal Jeevan Mission from 50% to 90%. The matter was examined and the State Government was informed that the current funding pattern is in consonance with the decision taken by the Governing Council of NITI Aayog, which in turn is based onthe recommendations of the Sub-group of Chief Ministers, constituted for the rationalisation of Centrally Sponsored Schemes.
