- (a) whether Air India has any plan to phase out the operation of Boeing 747 from the fleet;
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the reasons for their phasing out;

- (d) whether Boeing 747 aircrafts are fit enough and in a perfect state of maintenance for flying in case Air India considers them to be part of the fleet?
