Will the Minister of **Education** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Ministry has taken initiatives for teacher training and orientations for online and remote learning;
- (b) if so, the details of the same including funds disbursed till date, and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) whether the Ministry has assessed the need to reform the National Education Policy, 2020 to reflect the realities of online and remote education;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (e) whether the Ministry has formulated any directives to restructure the assessment for students through the virtual medium; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

**ANSWER**

(a) and (b) An Integrated Teacher Training Programme called NISHTHA was launched on 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2020, it is an online capacity building programme for "**Improving Quality of School Education through Integrated Teacher Training**". A total of 30 states and 8 autonomous organisations have started their courses on NISHTHA in 11 languages. Till date 5,17,25,114 (Five crore Seventeen Lakh Twenty five thousand One hundred and Fourteen) enrolments have been made on NISHTHA of which 4,61,75,725 (Four crore sixty one lakh seventy five thousand seven hundred twenty five) courses have been completed and certificates have been issued.

(c) and (d) National Education Policy 2020, has been formulated keeping present/futuristic view of remote and online education and its downsides. Para 24.1 and 24.2 explains the reality of the existing digital divide and how it can be optimized and expanded to meet the current and future challenges in providing quality education for all and Para 24.4 focuses on the initiatives to be undertaken leveraging technology for teaching and learning employing digital tools/solutions (Virtual Labs, Digital Repository, Online teaching platform, Digital Infrastructure, Online Examinations, Blended learning etc.)

(e) and (f) Education being in the concurrent list of the Constitution and majority of the schools, colleges and university are under the domain of respective State and UT Governments. The Central Government is constantly advising States/UTs through guidelines and meeting with respect to interventions for reducing impact of pandemic on education.
