Government of India has accorded approval for development of Major Port in VadHAVAN on landlord Port development modal due to its natural advantages and growing requirement of Import export trade of country. The Non-Major ports are under the jurisdiction of respective State Maritime Boards/States Governments.

Under Sagarmala Programme, Ministry provides financial assistance to State government port infrastructure projects, coastal berth projects, road and rail projects, fishery harbours, skill development projects, Coastal Community Development, International standard cruise terminal and unique and innovative projects such as Ro-Pax ferry services etc. The details of projects undertaken in coastal states under Sagarmala Programme is annexed. Ministry till date have funded 111 such projects out of which 40 have been completed, 42 are under implementation stage and 29 projects are under development. For the completed and under implementation projects, Ministry had released funds of approx Rs. 1400 cr and planned Rs. 865 crores for completion of current inventory of projects.
