- (a) whether decrease in coal demand was experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic period in the country;
- (b) if so, the quantum of fall in demand during the period and whether similar slump had been experienced in other countries also;
- (c) whether the demand has gone up to the level of the pre-COVID-19 period; and
- (d) whether there is any further plan by Coal India Limited to increase the production of coal and, if so, the details thereof?

# STATEMENT IN REPLY TO RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 71 FOR ANSWER ON 26/07/2021 BY SHRI SAMBHAJI CHHATRAPATI, M.P. REGARDING SLUMP IN COAL DEMAND DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

(a): Yes, Sir. There was a decline in coal demand during COVID-19 pandemic period in the country.

**(b):** During 2020-21, demand for coal was 905.88 MT as compared to 955.72 MT in 2019-20 signifying a decline of around 5%. While domestic coal dispatch contracted by 2.3%, imports contracted by 13% in 2020-21.

Authentic data on the effect of COVID-19 pandemic on global coal demand is not available. However, as per Global Economic Prospects June 2021, published by World Bank, Covid-19 pandemic caused a 3.5% contraction in the global economic activity in 2020.

**(c):** The momentum of growth of coal demand which began in the last quarter of fiscal 2020-21 continued in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of the current Fiscal as well. During the first quarter of FY' 2021-22, the domestic dispatch reached 195.2 MT which is significantly higher than 144.7 MT attained in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020-21 and 185.1 MT attained in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2019-20 (pre-COVID-19 period).

**(d):** Looking forward to the future demand scenario and in order to reduce non-essential import in the country, a plan has been prepared by Coal India Limited to increase coal production to 1 BT by 2023-24.
