CONSTRUCTION WORKERS IN CHHATTISGARH

1850. SMT. PHULO DEVI NETAM:

Will the Minister of Labour and Employment be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of construction workers registered under the Building and Other Construction Workers welfare board in the country, State-wise including Chhattisgarh as on date;**
- (b) the total funds collected and utilised under the Building and Other Construction Workers` Welfare Cess Act;**
- (c) whether there has been any considerable decrease in the number of workers registered with the various State Boards and said cess collection has gone down;**
- (d) if so, reaction of Government in this regard; and**
- (e) the steps taken by Government for the registration of more workers with the welfare board and also for effective utilisation of the funds collected under the said welfare cess?**

(c) & (d): Registration of workers is an on-going and continuous process. The details of number of registered BOC workers and cess collection is as under:

(e): Instructions under Section 60 of the Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 have been issued on 06.07.2020 to all States / UTs along with a copy of a Mission Mode Project (MMP) to register all the left-out BOC workers who were still not registered with the State Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Boards. This step will ensure that once registered, BOC worker will be eligible for the benefits of welfare schemes of the State Welfare Boards.

Further, several other instructions under Section 60 of the BOCW(RE&CS) Act, 1996 have also been issued from time to time to State/UT BOCW Welfare Boards for optimum utilization of the cess funds for the social security and other welfare measures of the BOC workers which include the benefits of welfare schemes of the State Welfare Boards and social security schemes of the Central/State Governments like Health Insurance Scheme through PM-JAY (Ayushman Bharat), Life and Disability Cover through PM-Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana, PM-Suraksha Bima Yojana and Pension after 60 years through PM-Shram Yogi Maandhan Pension Yojana and subsistence allowance during unemployment, illness, epidemics or natural calamities by using cess fund.
