- (a) the details of roads constructed, along with their length, under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in Assam during the last five years, district-wise;
- (b) the funds spent in Assam under PMGSY in Assam during the last five years, district- wise;
- (c) the details of villages yet to be connected with roads in Assam; and
- (d) by when all the villages in Assam would be connected with roads?

(a) The details of roads constructed under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in the State of Assam during the last 5 years are given below:

(c) & (d) Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojna (PMGSY-I) is a one-time special intervention to provide rural connectivity, by way of a single all-weather road, to the eligible unconnected habitations of designated population size (500+ in plain areas and 250+ in North-Eastern States, Himalayan States and Himalayan Union Territories as per 2001 census) in the core network for uplifting the socio-economic condition of the rural population. The unit for this Programme is a Habitation and not a Revenue village or a Panchayat. A Habitation is a cluster of population, living in an area, the location of which does not change over time.

In the state of Assam, 13,747 habitations with population 250+ were found eligible under PMGSY. Till now, 13,655 habitations have been provided connectivity and the deadline for providing connectivity to the balance 92 habitations is March, 2022.
