Shortage of teachers

341 Shri K.R.N. Rajeshkumar:

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) whether a large number of schools are still short of teachers and a number of schools operate out of kacheha buildings and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether underprivileged children still continue to drop out due to caste discrimination, inadequate preschooling and sheer poverty;
- (c) if so, the details thereof, State-wise; and
- (d) the corrective steps taken by Government in this regard?

A N S W E R MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN)

- (a) Education is in the Concurrent List of the Constitution. The recruitment, service conditions and redeployment of teachers are primarily in the domain of the respective State Government and UT Administration. The recruitment of teachers is a continuous process, and the vacancies keep arising due to retirement and additional requirements on account of enhanced students' strength. The details of number of schools operating out of kacheha buildings is enclosed as Annexure-A.
- (b) & (c) The drop out is due a combination of multiple factors and state-wise details are enclosed in Annexure-B.
- (d) Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Samagra Shiksha, which is an overarching scheme for school education covering all levels from pre-primary to senior secondary, financial assistance is provided to the States and UTs for various activities to reduce dropouts at all levels, which include opening/strengthening of new schools up to senior secondary level, strengthening school infrastructure, setting up, upgradation and running of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBV) upto class 12, setting up of residential schools/hostels named Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Avasiya Vidyalayas, transport allowance, undertaking enrolment drives, seasonal hostels/ residential camps, provision of vocational education and ICT facilities in schools, etc, financial assistance is also provided for aids and appliances for children with special needs.
