**SKILL DEVELOPMENT IN CHHATTISGARH, JHARKHAND AND ODISHA**

**Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:**

- (a) the total number of youth in Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha who have been imparted skill development training under skill development scheme during the last three years;
- (b) the steps taken by the State Governments to provide post-training employment at the local level; and
- (c) the amount of financial assistance released by Government to these States for this training programme during the last three years and the total amount of funds spent from this financial assistance by these States, till date?

(a) Under Skill India Mission, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) is implementing various schemes/projects related to skill development across the country including Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha. The major projects implemented by the MSDE are Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) and Jan Sikhshan Sansthan (JSS). The details of youth trained in Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha during last three years are as follows:

(b) Jharkhand:

Through Saksham Jharkhand Kaushal Vikas Yojana, Jharkhand Government aims at providing quality skills training to youth in the age group of 18-35 years and this scheme is being implemented across the state of Jharkhand. The Scheme aims at facilitating to facilitate employment to 70 percent of successful trainees through placement-linked and self-employment training in various trades/courses affiliated to different Sector Skills Councils (SSC).

Odisha:

Odisha Government, through Placement Linked Training programmes (PLTP), is addressing the complex problem of youth unemployment. An enrolled candidate is assured full support throughout the programme and post completion and is connected with the appropriate industry for job placements. Potential employers and business mentors and volunteers are brought in to support quality training. Under Odisha Skill Development Authority (OSDA), there are 39 PLTP in progress.

Chhattisgarh:

The Chhattisgarh Right of Youth to Skill Development Act, 2013 grants every person between the age of 14 to 45 the right to develop her or his skills from among notified skills, subject only to meeting eligibility requirements, and District Skill Development Authorities set up under District Collectors are bound to provide skill development training within 90 days of receiving any demand in this behalf. Along with urban unemployed, marginalized tribal population living in remote areas are the State's primary focus to reduce job-centric migrations and keep the potential workforce well within their local areas through processional skill training and dignified employment. Chhattisgarh Government has established 27 livelihood Colleges-one in every district, where resident training is imparted by government screened Vocational Training Providers (VTPs).

Ministry's efforts in those three states:

Under PMKVY, placement has been linked with pay-out to training providers. The last tranche, i.e., 30% of total pay-out is only disbursed to training providers on ensuring placement of the candidates. Further, Rozgar Melas are organised with the support of Sector Skill Councils, training providers, and implementing agencies to directly link the candidates with the potential employers. A Rozgar Mela is part of an employment strategy to fast-track the meeting of job employers and job seekers at the State level. The summary of Rozgar Melas in the three aforementioned states till 21<sup>st</sup> November, 2021 is as follows:

Counselling/Skill Saathi is a strategic intervention of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) implemented by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) to conduct ONLINE skills-based career counselling of potential candidates across India. Counselling will be conducted on a standardized module/content as defined by NSDC/MSDE. The details of Counselling/Skill Saathi conducted (from September 2018 to May 2019) for Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Odisha are as follows:
