Will the Minister of Coal be pleased to state:

- (a) the tasks performed by Coal India Limited (CIL) and its subsidiaries during the year 2020-21 from their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds for making the medical facilities better across the country; and
- (b) whether they have made any plan for improving the medical facilities, if so, the State-wise details thereof?

(a): Coal India Limited (CIL) and its subsidiary companies have undertaken healthcare related projects under Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Funds during year 2020-21 for the betterment of medical facilities. Due to the pandemic situation, special emphasis has been given to COVID-19 related healthcare activities. Out of the total CSR expenditure of Rs.553.85 crore during the year, Rs.309.16 crore were spent on healthcare related projects/activities. Details of the major healthcare projects undertaken by CIL and its subsidiaries companies under CSR Fund in 2020-21 are given below:

14	SECL	Setting up exclusive COVID-19 treatment centers at Bilaspur and Ambikapur in Chhattisgarh at a cost of Rs. 8.27 crore.
15	SECL	Financial support of Rs.2.96 crore in total to the following district administrations for prevention of COVID-19: 1. Madhya Pradesh: Shahdol, Anuppur, Umaria 2. Chattisgarh: Korba, Raigarh, Bilaspur, Surajpur, Surguja, Balrampur – Ramanujganj
16	CCL	Upgradation of 728 Anganwadis into Model Anganwadis in Jharkhand (Bokaro - 100 , Ranchi - 150, Hazaribagh - 61, Ramgarh 150, Latehar - 167, Chatra - 100) at a cost of Rs. 10.92 crore.
17	CCL	Research project to evaluate the relationship of burning fuel wood and biomass cooking on human eyes, cardiac chronic illness and mental health of native tribal communities of Jharkhand through AIIMS at a cost of Rs. 2.17 crore.
18	CCL	Research project titled, Traditional uses of Kachnar (Bauhinia Variegata) for human and nutrition: An epidemiological study in tribal districts of Jharkhand, India' through AIIMS at a cost of Rs. 4.12 crore.
19	ECL	Free medical camps through Mobile Medical Vans in 240 villages in Jharkhand and West Bengal (ECL command areas) at a cost of Rs. 1.53 crore.
20	BCCL	Financial assistance of Rs. 2.00 crore to District Administration of Dhanbad to combat COVID-19 situation

(b): CIL and its subsidiaries have been continuously working towards improvement in medical facilities being provided under CSR to the beneficiaries in its command area spread across different states.

Some of the initiative to improve medical facility, State-Wise is as follows:

CCL in the state of Jharkhand:

1. The Company is providing financial support for establishment of medical oxygen plant at 7 locations.
2. Construction of ICU of hospital at Village-Jorkat, District- Palamu, Jharkhand through Sri Krishna Sansthan
3. Setting up ICU at Sadar Hospital, Latehar
4. Contribution towards Set up of Pediatric ICU, Piped oxygen supported 25 bed facility at Welfare Hospital, Manan Chotag and PSA plant at Balumath, Latehar
5. Up-gradation of 100 Anganwadi centres into Model Anganwadi Centres at Chatra District for an amount of Rs. 150 lakhs
6. Operation of Hospital at Arogya Sewa Kendra, Sewa Dham, Jonha, Jharkhand for healthcare of nearby villagers

NCL in the State of Madhya Pradesh:

1. Financial assistance for establishment of 05 Oxygen generation plants in Bhopal, Indore, Rewa, Jabalpur and Sagar district and one plant at AIIMS Bhopal.
2. Financial Assistance for Procurement of Medical equipment and other health infrastructure in Singrauli district
3. Financial assistance for procurement of ALS ambulance to Rewa medical college

NCL in the State of Uttar Pradesh

1. Construction of 25 nos. Anganwadi buildings in Sonebhadra district
2. Renovation of 50 bedded Govt. hospital in Dibulganj, Anpara, Sonebhadra District
3. 05 Mobile medical Units for villages around NCL in Singrauli and Sonebhadra district.
