MUSEUM REFORMS IN THE COUNTRY

2099. SHRI JAWHAR SIRCAR:

Will the Minister of **CULTURE** be pleased to state:

- (a) Government policy regarding improvement of museums in the country, the details thereof;
- (b) the areas where success has been achieved or likely to be achieved in the next couple of years and those areas where problems are encountered or appear insurmountable;
- (c) number of posts that have been abolished in the central museums during the last five years and the reasons therefor;
- (d) number of sanctioned posts that are vacant and for how many years; and
- (e) the critical tasks that are being neglected or suffering in these museums and the action Government propose to take in this regard?

- (a) The Government initiated 14 point museum reforms agenda for implementation on a continuing basis to bring about best practices in museums in India keeping pace with the international developments in the field.
- (b) Some of the areas where success has been achieved are enumerated below:-
 - (i) To make effective utilization of technology in museum management and bringing the collections of these museums closer to the public by making them available for online viewing over the internet, Museums of India portal has been established.

- (ii) 2,90,616 artefacts/collections have been digitized in 10 Museums under Ministry of Culture.
 - (iii) Virtual Experiential Museums by making use of AR/VR technology have been established.
 - (iv) Projection Mapping/Light & sound shows to showcase India's rich cultural heritage have been started.
 - (v) The gallery specific display projection lights have been installed in the museums.
 - (vi) In order to make museums visit more useful to common man, Audio/Visual aids have been installed.
 - (vii) In order to enhance security of the objects RFID tagging of the objects has been initiated.
 - (viii) In order to promote ease of access, the museums have started online ticketing. The payments are accepted through various payment gateway/wallets.
- (c) The detail of number of posts that have been abolished in the central museums during the last five years, with reason therefor, is enclosed at **Annexure – I**.
- (d) The detail of number of sanctioned posts which are vacant is enclosed at **Annexure- II**. Most of these posts have fallen vacant due to superannuation, death, loss of utility of some of these posts in digital era, proposed revision in recruitment rules, etc. It is also pertinent to mention that the process to fill vacant posts is also underway.
- (e) No critical task has been neglected in museums under Ministry of Culture.
