ACCESS TO HEALTH SERVICES

1856. SHRI NEERAJ DANGI:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- a) whether only half of India's population has access to health services, as stated in Oxfam's Commitment to Reducing Inequality Index report;
- b) the average out of pocket expenditure of an Indian citizen, longitudinally;
- c) the total number of Indians availing services of Ayushman Bharat; and
- d) the details of the number and type of benefits received from Ayushman Bharat, Statewise?

(a)

"Public Health and Hospital" is a State subject, the primary responsibility of ensuring availability of healthcare facilities including access to health services lies with respective State/UT Governments. Government of India provides financial and technical support to States/UTs to strengthen their health care systems for provision of equitable, affordable healthcare to all its citizens particularly the poor and vulnerable population based on requirements posed by the States in their Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs).

According to National Sample Survey on Health for the year 2017-18 (75th round), the percentage of ailments treated on medical advice in rural areas is 86.2% and urban areas is 91.9%. The overall percentage is 88.3%.

(b)

According to the National Health Accounts Estimates India 2017-18, the out-of-pocket expenditure (OOPE) shows a decreasing trend. The per capita OOPE has decreased from Rs. 2336 in the year 2013-14 to Rs. 2097 in the year 2017-18. The out of pocket expenditure

(OOPE) has reduced from 64.2 percent in 2013-14 to 48.8 percent in 2017-18 of total health expenditure as per National Health Account of 2017-18. Details as below:

(c) and (d)

In the Union Budget 2018-19, Government of India announced two major initiatives in health sector, as part of Ayushman Bharat programme. The initiatives are as follows:-

- 1) Ayushman Bharat - Health and Wellness Centres (AB-HWCs): The programme aims to deliver Comprehensive Primary Health Care, which is universal and free to users, with focus on wellness and the delivery of an expanded range of services closer to the community.

As on 09th December, 2021, 80,701 HWCs are operational across the country. State-wise figures is at **Annexure-I**. As reported by the States/UTs in the HWC Portal:

- a total of 90.35 lakh wellness Sessions have been reported from these functional HWCs, which have been attended by 6.08 crore beneficiaries.
- 4.07 crore teleconsultations have been held at these AB-HWCs.
- 66.22 crore patients have received medicines.
- 25.49 crore beneficiaries have availed diagnostic tests. Please find the status of screenings done at the AB-HWCs
- At these AB-HWCs, 73.83 Crore footfalls have been recorded as on 09.12.2021, out of which 34.42 Crore are males and 39.4 Crore are female footfalls. Details at **Annexure-II**.

- 2) Ayushman Bharat- Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY): The second component envisages to cover over 10 crore poor and vulnerable families (approximately 50 crore beneficiaries) providing coverage up to 5 lakh rupees per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to accredit public and private health institutions.

As of 09th December 2021, approximately 2.54 Crore hospital admissions worth approximately Rs. 29,258 Crores have been authorized under AB PM-JAY. The services include 1,670 treatment procedures covering all the costs related to treatment, including

but not limited to drugs, supplies, diagnostic services, physician's fees, room charges, surgeon charges, OT and ICU charges etc. The State and Union Territory wise details of benefits availed i.e., authorized hospital admissions under AB PM-JAY is at **Annexure-III**.
