SMART CITIES MISSION IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

NO. 2452. MS. INDU BALA GOSWAMI:

Will the Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the period of the Smart Cities Mission run by Government has been extended;
- (b) if so, the duration of time by which it has been extended;
- (c) the cities in Himachal Pradesh selected under Smart Cities Mission;
- (d) whether the cost of this project is jointly borne by Central and State Governments both; and
- (e) if so, the ratio in which expenditure is borne by Central and State Governments and the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN AFFAIRS (SHRI KAUSHAL KISHORE)

(a) to (e): Government of India launched the Smart Cities Mission (SCM) on 25 June 2015. 100 Smart Cities have been selected through 4 rounds of competition from January 2016 to June 2018. The cities of Dharamshala & Shimla in Himachal Pradesh were selected as Smart Cities in Fast-track Round (May 2016) & in Round-3 (June 2017) respectively. As per SCM Statement & Guidelines, Government of India will provide financial support to the Mission to the extent of ₹ 48,000 crore over five years i.e. on an average ₹ 100 crore per city per year. An equal amount on a matching basis will be contributed by the State/Urban Local Body (ULB). The period of implementation of SCM has been extended upto June 2023 and all Smart Cities are expected to complete their projects within the stipulated time.
