**SHORTAGE OF MEDICINES IN AYUSH DISPENSARIES UNDER CGHS**

**961. SHRI RAM NATH THAKUR:**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that there has been an acute shortage of regarding prescribed medicines in the 'AYUSH dispensaries' under C.G.H.S. as the manufacturing units are facing various resource related issues;
- (b) if so, the plan being formulated by the Government to address these issues so that the regularly prescribed medicines can sufficiently be issued to the patients;
- (c) the reasons for supply of indented medicines in these dispensaries only after 15-20 days unlike the manner in which indented medicines are provided in allopathic dispensaries on very next day; and
- (d) whether Government would adopt any measures to remove this discrepancy?

(a) to (d) There is no major shortage of formulary medicines in AYUSH dispensaries/units under CGHS. Repeated tender process for the appointment of Authorized Local Chemists (ALCs) for the supply of medicines in AYUSH dispensaries/units under CGHS in Delhi has not yielded results. However, following options are available to the beneficiaries in case of non-availability of prescribed medicines in AYUSH dispensaries/units:

1. They may collect medicines indented through Authorized Local Chemists (ALCs) from AYUSH dispensaries/units after the supply thereof reaches the concerned dispensary/unit.
2. They may purchase the prescribed medicines from open market and claim reimbursement thereof.

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
