FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAMME FOR POPULATION CONTROL

2992: SHRI K.R.N. RAJESH KUMAR: DR. KANIMOZHI NVN SOMU:

Will the MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Family Planning Programme is the top most priority of Government for population control, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Family Planning Programme has been successful in achieving its targets and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether sufficient financial resources are provided for the Family Planning Programme and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) the status of the progress made regarding success/failure of the Family Planning Programme being run for population control in the country, State/UT-wise?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) The Government accords top priority to the National Family Planning Program by providing family planning services both at facility and community levels viz. Injectable contraceptive, Intra uterine contraceptive device (IUCD), Sterilization services, Condoms and Oral Contraceptive Pills, including Home Delivery of Contraceptives.
- (b) As a result of these efforts, the following progress has been achieved:
 - The Total Fertility Rate (TFR) declined to **2.0 in 2019-21** (NFHS 5) which is below replacement level.
 - 31 out of 36 States/ UTs have achieved replacement level fertility (NFHS 5).
 - The **Modern Contraceptive usage** has increased to **56.5%** (NFHS 5).
 - The Unmet Need for Family Planning has declined to 9.4% (NFHS 5).
 - The Crude Birth Rate (CBR) has declined to 19.7 in 2019 (SRS).

(c) Sufficient financial resources are made available to States/ UTs for carrying out Family Planning activities under the National Health Mission (NHM).

Funds allocated to core Family Planning activities in 2020-21under NHM- Rs. 1263.26 crore.

(d) States/ UT-wise Total Fertility Rate (TFR) and Modern Contraceptive use (MCPR) status as per NFHS 5 (2019-21) is placed at **Annexure**.
