**ESTABLISHMENT OF STATE INSTITUTES OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT**

2533. SHRI K.C. VENUGOPAL:

Will the Minister of **TOURISM** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Central Institutes of Hotel Management presently functioning, State/UT-wise;
- (b) whether Government extends support to State Governments to set up State Institutes of Hotel Management in their States;
- (c) if so, the number of such Institutes set up during each of the last three years and the current year along with the financial allocation for this purpose;
- (d) the challenges faced by these institutes while imparting quality education and training to students; and
- (e) whether these Institutes have been successful in contributing to the growth of tourism sector in the country and if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER**

(a): There are 21 Central Institutes of Hotel Management (CIHMs) presently functioning in the country. The details of Institutes, State/UT wise, is at Annexure-I.

(c): The number of State Institute of Hotel Management (SIHM) affiliated during last three years and current year is as under:
